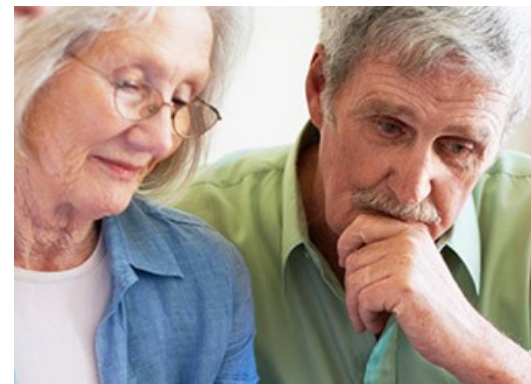

There is modest compensation for participation. *All participants must have a family member or close friend as their study partner to accompany them to visits.*

What to expect?

- A physical exam
- A neurological exam
- History and symptom survey
- Evaluation of memory and thinking
- Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI)
- Blood draw and/or saliva sample collection

Who can participate?

- Adults over the age of 55
- Healthy older adults with or without memory complaints
- Adults with a diagnosis of Mild Cognitive Impairment, Alzheimer's Disease or a related dementia



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
